## SCLT Historic Preservation Mission Preserving our unique Wyoming identity

Public and private property owners work with Sheridan Community Land Trust to permanently preserve and interpret significant historic structures and sites. Preserving historic places and sites maintain and enhance our region's character and economy.

## PRESERVATION EASEMENTS AND HISTORIC INTERPRETATION

#### Sheridan Inn

The Sheridan Inn is a historical treasure to Sheridan, Wyoming and is the first historical easement in the State of Wyoming.

#### **Doc Huson Homestead**

In 2015, a conservation land easement and a historical preservation easement was celebrated to protect the land, the Huson homestead, and the rich history that comes with it.

## Acme Powerplant

Many local residents have a strong connection to the Acme Powerplant, because of the people that used to live and/or work in the Acme community and the previous northern mining towns of Sheridan County.

## Black Diamond Byway

Stretching north from Sheridan for about 15 miles, the Black Diamond Trail highlights Sheridan County coal mine districts from 1910 to 1920s.
